The museum is growing up and so are the kids!

When construction began on the Nido & Mariana Qubein Children's Museum in 2020, you may remember the fence surrounding the site; lined with life-sized photos

of more than 100 local children, from infants to 12-year-olds. We saw those photos every day as the museum took shape— and now, three years into operations, we have seen those same children come through our doors. In fact, we've watched them grow up.

Charlie's fence photo showed him as barely a toddler, still unsteady on his feet with a beaming smile. When the museum opened, Charlie spent most of his time in GiNormous sliding down the World's Largest Chest of Drawers, making shadows under the bed, and sitting crisscross applesauce on a beanbag during story time.

Today, Charlie is a confident 7-year-old who walks into this museum like he owns the place. He climbs to the top of our 30-foot Courage Climber, reads clues in the Hall of Mysteries, and builds seed bombs and other science experiments in our

STEAM Lab. His smile still beams but he's missing some teeth.

In three years, the Nido & Mariana Qubein Children's Museum has welcomed thousands of visitors from across North Carolina and beyond. Thanks to word of mouth and social media, families have traveled from far and wide to experience this special place of joy, learning and play.

This museum has generated an economic impact to our community of \$60 million because of those visitors—an outcome we never imagined.

We're proud of our economic impact, but it's the role we're playing in the lives of local children that brings the most meaning. For kids like Charlie, growing up in High Point includes growing up in this museum. We're honored to be a part of that journey for families in our community.

WE ARE A CERTIFIED AUTISM CENTER!

Our staff is trained to better serve autistic individuals and those with sensory needs. We have implemented sensory-friendly practices, providing special kits at our welcome desk with noise canceling headphones, sunglasses, special directions on our website and our front desk that help parents plan their visit. The Qubein Children's Museum offers special sensory sessions once a month, usually the first Tuesday of every month from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. During these sessions, we lower sounds, dim lights and limit crowd size for those who need a calmer, quieter experience. Play, Learn, Connect — 2024 Play Symmit



Noon Year's Eve Celebration






Thank You to our Donors!
